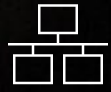

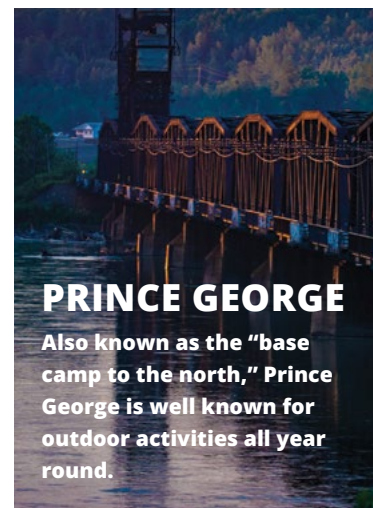

**Cross country ski** at Caledonia Nordic Ski Club, and ice skate the outdoor ice oval.

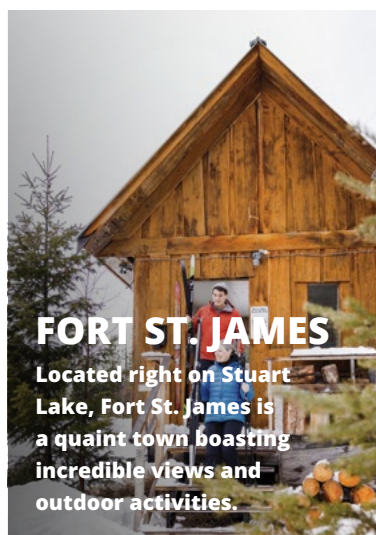

**Discover the town** and take in the National Historic Site, Spirit Square, and Goodwin Park.

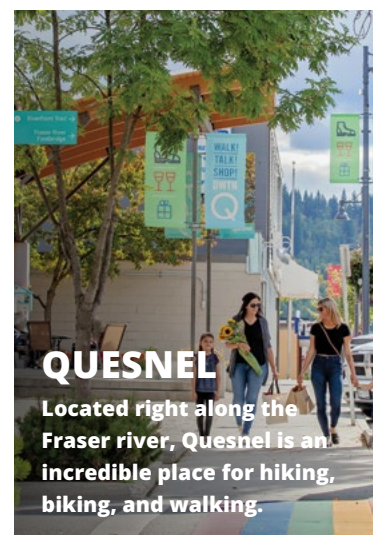

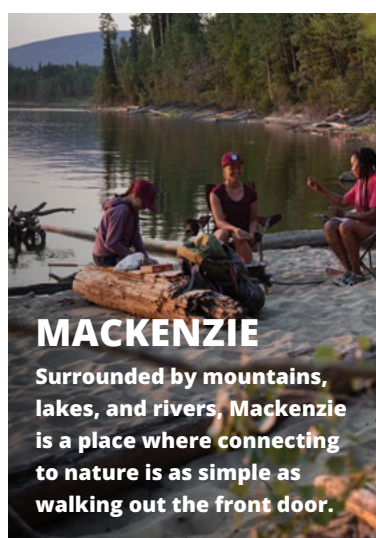

**Swim, kayak, and fish** on Williston Lake or McLeod Lake.

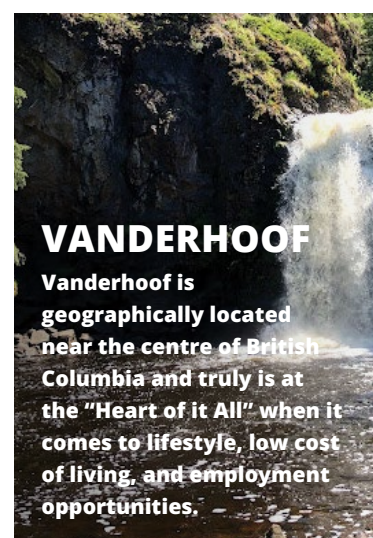

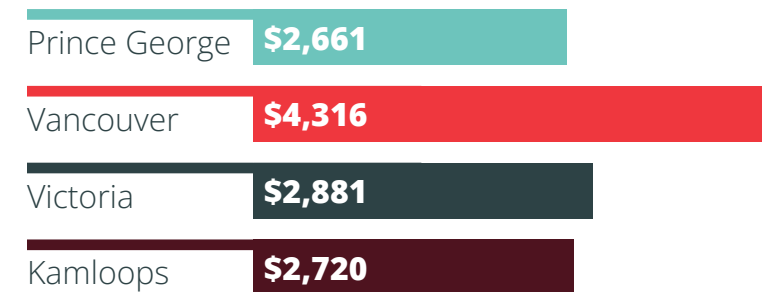

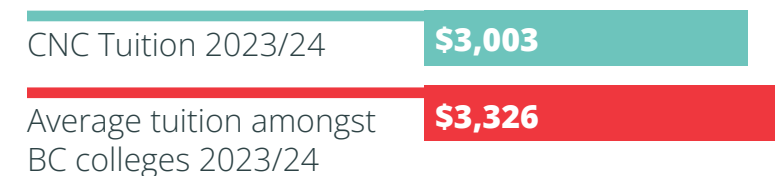

## CAMPUS HOUSING: NAHOONAI-A

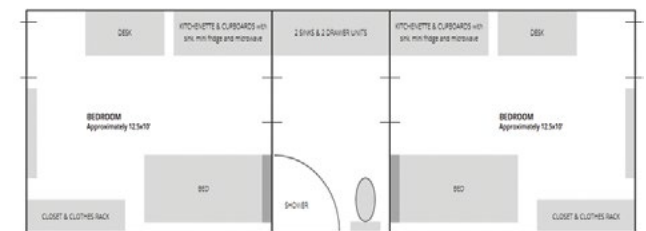
*Nahoonai-a: "To find" or "To rediscover"*  
Named by Lheidli T'enneh First Nation Elder Josie Paul, the building is called Nahoonai-a, which means "to find" or "to rediscover." Nahoonai-a is designed as a culturally safe, supportive, traditional community experience for Indigenous students. Students may stay in Nahoonai-a for a maximum of one year. After that, students may apply to the Main Building.

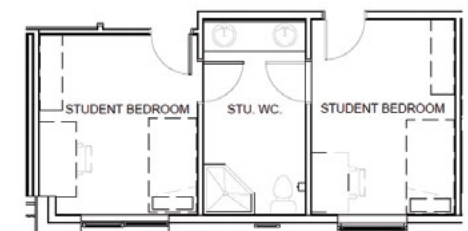

# GET HELP PAYING FOR COLLEGE

**Education should be accessible for everyone, and you shouldn't have to worry about finances while you study. Financial Aid and Awards is available to all CNC students, because everyone needs a little extra help during college.**

## STUDENT LOANS

Full-time loans are available for students enrolled in a minimum of 3 courses (or 9 credits). Part-time loans are available to students studying less than 3 courses (8 credits or less). We offer consultation on student loan issues and can assist with your application for financial assistance.



## EMERGENCY LOANS

Emergency loans are available to students who are experiencing unforeseen financial emergency situations. If you are a current student who is experiencing emergency financial hardship, you may be eligible to apply for CNC Emergency Funding.



## AWARDS

Scholarships and bursaries are awarded based on academic achievement, and on financial need. Unlike loans, these do not need to be repaid.



## SCHOLARSHIPS

A scholarship is a financial award granted based on academic achievement. Depending on the scholarship, there may be a minimum GPA requirement. Most scholarships must be applied to by a specified deadline.



## BURSARIES

A bursary is a financial award granted based on financial need. Students who are using loans or bursary funding may still apply to receive a bursary. Most bursaries must be applied to by a specified deadline.



## ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Entrance Scholarships are available for students to apply to immediately after being accepted into a program at CNC. You could receive up to \$2,000 before you even step on campus by applying to one of our entrance scholarships.
